12 Step to Obtain Status as a Carolina Yard



Would you like to have a beautiful yard by following scientific methods while protecting the environment and water ways? Carolina Yards is a program sponsored by Clemson University that allows you to accomplish this feat. Carolina Yards is designed to help gardeners conserve water, make positive changes to the environment, your yard, neighborhood and surrounding water ways. Through sustainable landscaping practices, you can create an aesthetically pleasing landscape that works with the local environment. Also, the activities you practice in your yard can positively impact natural resources as well as allow you to gain the status of a certified Carolina Yard.

In order to receive a Certified Yard, your yard will be evaluated based on 12 principles of the Carolina Yard Program. When you meet the requirements,

you can obtain a certified Carolina Yard status, receive a certificate and have the option to purchase recognition items from the Carolina Store to display in your yard highlighting your status. Further information may be obtained by visiting a demonstration of a Carolina Yard maintained by the Richland County Master Gardeners Association located at the Clemson Station on Clemson Road.
